Erik Omar Atayde of Goodwill Industries of El Paso was recently recognized by WorkQuest with the 2023 Artie Lee Hinds Award. The award honors an outstanding Community Rehabilitation Program (CRP) employee for leadership, dedicated service and commitment to excellence.

Atayde began his career as a groundskeeper at Goodwill six years ago. He's since worked his way up to a lead custodial position.

"He is a beacon of light," Melinda Jordan, CEO of Goodwill Industries of El Paso, said. "He goes into people's offices and his facial expressions, his smile and his positive attitude bring brightness to every workplace that he's encountered."

Atayde is more than just an employee, he serves as a mentor in several different ways. At Goodwill, he not only trains and helps his colleagues in the custodial department, but he's also taught his supervisors a thing or two.

"A lot of our senior leadership team has taken ASL classes to better help serve and communicate with our employees and customers that are deaf," Jeff Crox, district manager at Goodwill Industries of El Paso, said.

"Erik came to our graduation ceremony to help cheer us on. But at the same time, he was sitting there correcting some of our bad sign language."

Atayde also finds time outside of work to be a mentor in the El Paso community as a coach to a youth football team. "It's incredible the fact that he understands the sport so well. So it kind of makes it obvious the fact that he's a coach," Atayde's brother Victor, said. "He's always teaching the kids new things. And on top of that, teaches them little words in sign language."

"People that are deaf are so willing to work and help," Erik Omar Atayde added. "And if they don't know how to start, we're here to help them. As a deaf person, I can help other people grow."

The entire team at Goodwill Industries of El Paso is impressed with Atayde's work, and so proud of what he has been able to accomplish in all aspects of his life.

"What he's able to do for us as an organization and what he's able to do for himself and his family is just remarkable," Jordan added.

Among those honored were Terry Smith Jr. of Peak Performers who earned the Most Inspirational Employee award; and Gary Seegers of E.Q.U.I.P. Thomas recounted his experience as an Army Ranger in a 1993 battle in Mogadishu, Somalia, now commonly known as "Blackhawk Down". Thomas spoke about the intricacies of his leadership during the journey to rescue his fellow soldiers, and how we can redefine the way we understand what it means to be a leader in the journey of life.

Following the keynote address, WorkQuest recognized the Top 10 customers who purchase products, services and temporary employment services through the *WorksWonders* Program. These customers include multiple state, city and county agencies and organizations. Organizations that were recognized for being new to this year's lists for their purchase of products included the Texas Military Department and Teacher Retirement System of Texas.

Event attendees got a peek into the everyday lives of the evening's award winners including Smith and Seegers via short videos highlighting interviews with their families, colleagues and supervisors. Surrounded by his parents and brother, Erik Omar Atayde of Goodwill Industries of El Paso, Inc. took home the pinnacle award of the event, the 2023 Artie Lee Hinds Award. Atayde was recognized for his hard work, positive attitude and leadership both at his job and with young people in the El Paso community.

WorkQuest hosts 35th annual Products and Services Expo



On September 26, 2023, WorkQuest hosted its 35th annual Products and Services Expo. During this event, Community Rehabilitation Program (CRP) representatives were able to connect with customers and purchasers. CRPs display their products and speak about the products, services and temporary employment opportunities they offer through the State Use *WorksWonders* Program – the Program that helps connect Texans with disabilities with meaningful employment opportunities.

CRPs are located throughout the state of Texas, so for many of these organizations, the Expo is the one time a year where they get to see their customers in person and have the opportunity to network.

"This is one of the only opportunities where we get to see and interact with the purchasers," Lee Tillson, senior vice president of sales and marketing at Horizon Industries, said. "WorkQuest is the conduit for us to be able to sell our products to the different state agencies. We sell 10,000 pairs of boots a year and these sales include a lot of individual transactions that WorkQuest is very involved in."

Additionally, CRPs appreciate the exposure they get from participating in the Expo and use it as an opportunity to create connections with prospective customers that can lead to new contacts.





"We have been attending this event for over 10 years and we gain a lot of connections from it," Tiffany Velasquez, workforce development Manager at PCSI, said. "The biggest benefit of the State Use Program is being able to employ individuals with disabilities and fulfill our company's mission".



A major benefit to purchasers who attend the Expo is the opportunity to learn about the products and services offered through the *WorksWonders* Program that they may not be aware of.

"When we attend this event, it's important for us to find other businesses that might not be as highlighted," Amanda Gomez, purchaser at the Teacher Retirement System of Texas, said. "The Expo provides a great opportunity for exposure and allows us to meet new people and new vendors that may provide services we didn't think to consider and solutions to problems we already have."

The Products and Services Expo was able to bring more than 350 CRP representatives and purchasers together this year. Purchasers appreciate the convenience of this event and enjoy exploring new products and services that their companies can benefit from.

"The most helpful aspect of this event is getting to know the vendors and actually seeing the products they offer in person," Margaret Scarborough, budget analyst at the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, said. "And of course, meeting the people behind the products."





